

## Great Trees in Cornwall

Beginning in 2005 the Cornwall Conservation Advisory Council sponsored a hunt for the grandest trees in Cornwall. Trees were identified by their owners or neighbors, and visited by members of the CCAC. With the owners' permission volunteers went out and measured each tree's height, girth and crown spread. These dimensions were used to determine the greatest trees in our community. The largest of each species was identified, as were the trees that were the tallest, the fattest, and having the broadest crown regardless of tree type. And finally Cornwall's Champion Tree – a Sycamore - was named, determined by formula combining all these dimensions.


Late in the year, bare trees reveal their complex branching.

[Silver Maple – largest trunk]


